

Outline for Law Enforcement Briefing on California Child Restraint Law

This outline was designed to be used by Child Passenger Safety Technicians, health educators, law enforcement training staff, or any other presenter who prepares by carefully reviewing the briefing packet. Allow about 20 minutes for the presentation.

Preparation for Presentation

Go to www.carseat.org>Laws-Regs> to view or order materials listed below.

- Briefing packet. Download and reproduce.
- Brochure: The Perfect Gift. View on site; download order form.
- Citation reminder cards. View on site; call SBS USA for a supply of cards at no cost (one card per officer in the field).
- Motivational photos (laminated posters, 11 x 17"). View on site; download order form.
- Worksheet answers. Download and reproduce.

Presentation Outline

1. Place materials at each seat or distribute at door (briefing packet, citation reminder card, brochure, list of local safety seat distribution programs). Ask officers to fill out the worksheet while they are waiting for the presentation to start.

2. Briefly introduce yourself, your agency, and any child passenger safety programs available in your community.

3. Presentation

- Thank the officers for giving their time. We realize they have many other priorities.
- Use #99 (pg. 2-4 of packet) as outline for presentation.
- Go over other materials in packet, brochures, citation reminder card.
- Show motivational photos during presentation.
- If your jurisdiction has a child restraint law violator program, describe the program. If not, consider contacting SBS USA about implementing the Family Safety in the Car program.
- Distribute worksheet answers at the end; discuss them if there is time.
