Guidelines for Child Care Providers

Car crashes are the number one cause of death and serious injury for children. How can you protect the children in your care and also protect yourself and your business from liability?

Make sure you know how to drive safely with children of all ages. Can you answer all of these questions?

- How do I choose the right kinds of seats for different kids?
- Are used car seats safe?
- How can I tell if a safety seat is on recall?
- How long should children ride facing the back of the car?
- How can I tell if a child is ready to wear just a safety belt?
- Why should children ride in the back seat?
- How can I keep a child from getting out of his safety seat?
- Can I get a ticket if I make a safety seat error?
