## **Ideas for PTA Groups to Promote Car Safety for Children**

- 1. Encourage parents of school-age children to:
  - a. Provide a booster seat and/or safety belt for each child on every ride.
  - b. Show older children why they need to be buckled up with a video, such as "Keeping Children Safe in Crashes" or implement "Boosters Are For Big Kids" curriculum.
  - c. Insist on a booster seat and/or safety belt for every child during field trips, Scout/athletic team transportation. It's the law!
  - d. Work with after-school programs to restrain children in vehicles when they collect the children from schools or take them on field trips.
  - e. Make sure safety belts and appropriate child restraints are used in buses and vans transporting children with special needs.
  - f. Utilize sources of more information on proper child restraint devices, such as "The Perfect Gift: Your Child's Safety," available from SafetyBeltSafe U.S.A.
  - g. Show an educational/motivational video, such as "Don't Risk Your Child's Life IX," or the "Boosters Are For Big Kids" DVD at a parent meeting.

## 2. Within the school program:

- a. For K-3, introduce "Boosters Are For Big Kids" curriculum in classroom, at parent meetings. Covers the 5-Step Test, reasons to use boosters, has homework and classroom activities. Available from SafetyBeltSafe U.S.A.
- b. For 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades, introduce "Belt Use Basics" which is part of the "Boosters Are For Big Kids" program.
- c. Include information on proper restraint use in the following programs:
  - 1) Driver education
  - 2) Family life electives
  - 3) Vocational programs for those who work with children
  - 4) Preschool centers attached to public/private schools
  - 5) Programs for pregnant teenagers
  - 6) Health education classes
- d. Do a survey of safety belt usage by observing activity near the school in the morning and afternoon and publicize it in the school newsletter. (Forms available from SafetyBeltSafe U.S.A.)
- e. Sponsor a traffic safety poster and essay contest in the school. Make posters of students' homework color sheets and have local stores put them up for a week.
- f. Celebrate Safety Seat Checkup Week.
- g. Join SafetyBeltSafe U.S.A. and help spread the word through business, medical, preschool, law enforcement, and other professional communities.
